- are staffed by female technologists board-certified in mammography and board-certified radiologists, experienced in the interpretation of mammograms
- are equipped with full field digital technology, allowing images to be viewed in seconds so the technologist can check for proper positioning, reducing the possibility of coming back for repeat images
- having dressing rooms that provide absolute privacy
- double-check all mammography images with a computer-aided detection system that detects 23 percent more breast cancers than mammography alone
- and are accredited by the American College of Radiology (ACR) and the Mammography Quality Standards Acts (MQSA).
